Investing in our people

Our people make our city. When Canberrans are empowered they can achieve extraordinary things.

We will unashamedly support our nurses, teachers, police, paramedics and firefighters. We will put these frontline Canberrans first because they have always put us first.

We will boost apprenticeships and vocational training so small businesses have the skills they need for the future.





Creating a world class health system

We will support our GPs because they are the bedrock of our health system. We will abolish Andrew Barr's GP tax that will make it more expensive for Canberrans to see their doctor.

We will fix the toxic culture in our hospitals that is driving away our frontline health professionals and we will not divert promised funding for critical health infrastructure to politically motivated projects.

Developing a nationleading education system

We will set up our children for success by supporting our teachers in delivering evidence-led approaches to improving literacy and numeracy.

We will recruit more teachers and lift the burden of unnecessary paperwork so they can do what they do best - teach.

Supporting small business, innovation & investment

We will reduce the regulatory burden on small business and respect what they bring to our city. We will back Canberrans who want to grow their businesses and stay local.



Moving our city forward

We won't be spending billions of dollars on a tram that will serve only a fraction of Canberrans and which will be slower than the current bus. Our public transport policy will be based on the transport needs of our people, not based on a political marriage of convenience.



Getting the basics right

For too long, Canberra's suburbs have been neglected.

We will get the basics right because we know we must get our own backyard in order before we can take on the world. Each Canberra suburb is unique and we will make sure the community has a say in what we see in our suburbs.

Looking after our green spaces and wildlife

Canberrans love our bush capital and we care deeply about our environment.

We will value our green spaces, woodlands and waterways and we will look after our wildlife. These are the unique elements of our bush capital that make our city the beautiful, natural home that it is and we will cherish it.



35 commitments we have already made

We will:

- abolish Andrew Barr's GP tax 1.
- 2. hold a Royal Commission into our health system
- 3. establish a gynaecology oncology unit
- engage contractors to reduce 4. colonoscopy and endoscopy wait lists
- explore retention measures for frontline 5. health workers
- bring in defibrillators in schools and government buildings
- 7. develop a men's health plan
- 8. not proceed with Stage 2B of the tram
- 9. improve bus priority and upgrades between Belconnen and the city
- 10. reinstate funding for road upgrades that were diverted to the tram
- not ban internal combustion engine 11.
- 12. repeal the drug decriminalisation laws
- 13. amend bail laws to protect frontline workers
- 14. undertake a review into bail and sentencing laws
- 15. open a police station in Molonglo
- release Cabinet documents within 30 days of decision
- give more resources to the Integrity Commission, including telephone intercept powers
- 18. review and audit government procurement processes
- 19. undertake an independent audit of the ACT's budget
- 20. create a Minister for Housing Affordability and Choice
- 21. release more land for detached housing

- 22. undertake a feasibility study into land at West Tuggeranong for housing
- 23. work with the federal government to access CSIRO land for housing
- 24. ease the tax and regulatory burden on rental properties
- 25. overhaul the planning system to include more transparency and community consultations
- 26. allow separately titled dual occupancies on RZ1 blocks
- 27. support our teachers to use evidencebased methods to improve literacy and numeracy
- 28. ban mobile phones in schools
- 29. establish a town centre in Molonglo
- 30. keep Stromlo Forest Park free and accessible
- 31. invest more funding into improving our suburbs
- 32. explore new ways to improve water quality in our lakes and waterways
- 33. not ban gas
- 34. not ban woodfire heaters
- 35. explore options for a city stadium and convention centre
